CALL FOR ADMISSION TO THE FIVE-YEAR ONE-CYCLE DEGREE IN PHARMACY
(CLASS LM-13 DM 270/2004 PHARMACY AND INDUSTRIAL PHARMACY)

A.Y. 2025/2026

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Art. 1 – Places available and selection rounds

For the academic year 2025/2026, The University of Rome Tor Vergata officially opens the call for admission in the first year to the five-year One-cycle Degree in Pharmacy for a total number of 80 places, distributed as follows:

- a) 60 (sixty) places available to Italian citizens, EU citizens and non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy (Art. 2, Italian Law n. 189/2002);
- b) 20 (twenty) places reserved to non-EU citizens resident abroad applying for the visa.

The number of places established by the Italian Law n. 264, 02/08/1999.

The Degree Course will have **two rounds of selection**. The total number of places available will be divided accordingly.

- **FIRST ROUND: 40 places of which 10 places** are reserved for non-EU citizens residing abroad.
- **SECOND ROUND: 40 places of which 10 places** are reserved for non-EU citizens residing abroad In addition to any available spaces for each category after the first round.

PLEASE NOTE

- For the registration for the selection, the methods of carrying out and the structure, please refer to articles 3, and 4.
- **It is necessary for the registration in the selection and successive enrolment, to respect the deadlines and procedures set out in this call.**
- **Only after having been successful in the selection procedure in accordance to art. 4, it is possible to pre- enrol/enrol by following the relative instructions in Art. 8 and 9**

The Course is held at the Department of Biology, School of Mathematical, Physical and Natural Sciences the beginning of the classes is scheduled for the 13th of October 2025.

Attendance to lessons and laboratory activities is mandatory.

English is the official language of the Course.

Art. 2 - Requirements for participation in the selection

Italian citizens, EU citizens and non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy referred to in Art. 26 of law 189/202 can participate to the admission test as well as foreign/international citizens applying for a visa.

To be admitted to participate in the admission test of this call, it **is mandatory to have a second level secondary school diploma** issued by Italian educational institutions (according to current legislation) or a foreign qualification considered valid for admission to university courses activated in Italian universities (see Art.12 of this call).

Students enrolled in the last year of Italian secondary schools of second grade, or in the last year of a secondary school of non-Italian secondary school that confers a valid qualification for admission to university courses activated at Italian universities, and who expect to achieve the Diploma by the enrolment dates provided for in this call, **can also participate.**



To participate in the selection, it is also necessary to have a good knowledge of the English language which will be verified through an oral interview as described in the following Art. 4.

Art. 3 – How to apply to the admission test

Candidates who meet the requirements in Article 2 must submit their applications on the Delphi University online services portal, <http://delphi.uniroma2.it>, during the specified periods.

- **FIRST ROUND:** from 20 January 2025 to 5 March 2025
- **SECOND ROUND:** from 2 April 2025 to 2 July 2025

Each candidate can participate in all the active selection rounds by submitting a specific application for participation for each round via the Delphi University online services site using the following procedure:

1. Connect to the Delphi Online: <http://delphi.uniroma2.it/>;
2. Select Student Section, Key 1=> “Enrolment in the assessment tests” => a. Fill in the application form >check the box “*I declare that I have read the privacy information*”=> select “Faculty of Mathematical, Physics and Natural Sciences” => select the chosen degree course and insert the requested information.

Afterwards,

- Italian, EU and non-EU students legally residing in Italy must select the chosen course > “*non reserved seats*”(*)
- Non-EU students residing abroad applying for a visa must select the chosen course > “*foreign citizens residing abroad applying for a visa*”

3. Fill in the application entering the information requested (NOTE: enter “name” and “surname” **as printed in your passport or other valid picture id.**

- All candidates must upload a valid identification document.
- Only non-EU candidates will also have to:
 - *Upload the valid residence permit. If expired, upload the expired permit and the renewal request.*
 - *Declare whether you are enrolled at another Italian university, specifying whether you are attending a degree or a single course (**).*

At the end of the procedure, an application and bulletin will be produced containing a CTRL code and an AUTH code.

PLEASE NOTE: In the application the fiscal code will be calculated for non-resident international students.

4. **Print** the application (to be saved) and the bulletin of €30,00 Euro for the participation to the selection.

5. **Pay** the due participation fee through the PagoPa system, a payment method that allows to pay through a plurality of channels, in person or online.

- In this phase the data entered and the attachments uploaded within the application form can be modified by returning to the DELPHI system

6. **Log back** on the Delphi online Services:

<https://delphi.uniroma2.it/totem/jsp/homeStudenti.jsp?language=EN> 1. Registration for the admission tests” > b. “You have already completed the application” > Enter the requested data and proceed to **validate the payment**. A protocol number will be assigned to each candidate.

(*) () IMPORTANT:** Students residing in Italy with a **residence permit for study purposes**, obtained **through enrollment in single courses**, are eligible to participate in the selection process as candidates equivalent to EU citizens. Enrollment will be permitted only if both of the following conditions are met:

- **the course must be relevant to the single-cycle master's degree in Pharmacy** mentioned in this notice
- **the single course must be completed by the enrolment deadline and have a positive final exam outcome.**

If any of the requirements mentioned above are not met, the candidate will not be able to enrol.

For additional information, please refer to Article 12 and the Student Guide for the academic year 2025/2026.

PLEASE NOTE:

- It is essential to carry out, under penalty of exclusion from the selection, **both the payment and the online validation of the payment** within the indicated deadline to complete the registration procedure and participate in the test.
- After validation there is no possibility to modify the application.

The contribution of Euro 30.00 for participation in the selection is non-refundable for any reason.

The contribution **is not due by:**

-Students with a disability equal to or greater than 66% or with recognition of disability according to Article 3 paragraph 1 of the Law of 5 February 1992 n. 104 (the condition of disability must be indicated in the application for participation in the competition).

These candidates, exempted from paying the participation fee for the tests, will still have to validate the zero-amount slip using the CTRL and AUTH codes automatically assigned by the computer system, present on the application form.

The University reserves the right to check the truthfulness of the declarations made, under penalty of exclusion from access to the test.

Art.4 - Selection procedures and evaluation criteria

The selection of candidates is aimed at ascertaining the **appropriate initial preparation** of the candidate and the predisposition for the subjects covered by the Degree Programme referred to in this Call (pursuant to art. 6, paragraph 1, of D.M. 270/2004) as well as an **appropriate knowledge of the English language** as indicated in art. 5 of the Regulation of the single cycle CdLM in Pharmacy.



The admission test for access to the single-cycle master's degree course in Pharmacy will consist of two assessment moments:

- a) **Written test:** 60 multiple choice questions aimed at ascertaining the preparation regarding the disciplines of secondary schools such as Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology as well as notions of general culture.

The test is carried out in English.

- b) **Oral exam:** aimed at verifying the knowledge of the English language and at ascertaining the preparation regarding the disciplines of upper secondary schools such as Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology as well as notions of general culture.

Test schedule

- **FIRST ROUND:**
 - **Deadline for submitting applications is: Wednesday 5 March 2025.**
 - **Written test: Wednesday, 19 March 2025 at 8:30 AM**
 - **Oral test: Wednesday, 19 March 2025 at 2:30 PM**

- **SECOND ROUND:**
 - **Deadline for submitting applications is on Wednesday, 2 July , 2025.**
 - **Written test: Wednesday, 9 July 2025 at 8:30 AM**
 - **Oral test: Wednesday 9 July at 2:30 PM**

The written test will take place at the Department of Biology of the Macroarea of Sciences MM.FF.NN., Via della Ricerca Scientifica n. 1 – 00133 Rome, at 9:30 a.m, rooms 1, 2 and 4, building PP1.

Candidates are called at 8:30 a.m. on the same day for the identification procedures in alphabetical order, which will be promptly published on the CdIM website following the application deadline.

A maximum of 90 minutes will be allotted to complete the test.

The **oral exam** will take place after the revision of the written exam, starting at 2.30 pm, if necessary, may continue the following day. Only candidates who have obtained the minimum score required to pass the written test will be admitted to the oral test.

Evaluation criteria

The score obtained in the written test and the score obtained in the oral interview are considered by the Commission as evaluation criteria for the purpose of forming the merit ranking referred to in the following Art. 6.

The evaluation is fulfilled on a scale of 80 total points of which:

- **Up to 60 points** obtained in the written test (**minimum score required to access the oral test 24/60**);



The test score is determined as follows:

- Correct answer: **1 point**
- Incorrect answer or not given: **0 points**
- **Up to 20** points obtained in the oral interview in English **(the candidate is qualified with a minimum score of 10/20).**

IMPORTANT:

On the day of the test, **all candidates must show** a valid identification document/passport already uploaded on Delphi during registration for the selection and payment receipts of the 30,00-euro payment slip.

Furthermore:

- **non-EU candidates legally residing in Italy** must also present a photocopy of their valid residence permit; if expired, a photocopy of the expired permit and the renewal request.
- **non-EU candidates residing abroad and applying for a study visa** must submit a photocopy of the pre-enrolment application presented on University. **The deadline for submitting the pre-enrolment application on the University portal is:**
 - **5 March 2025** for candidates choosing to participate in the **first round**.
 - **2 July 2025** for candidates choosing to participate in the **second round**.

Candidates may not bring bags, briefcases, mobile phones, smartphones, notes, manuscripts, books or publications into the classroom. Any other material is equally prohibited, unless otherwise decided by the Commission. The use of scientific calculators is permitted if they do not require an electrical or wireless connection.

During the admission test, candidates are not allowed to communicate with each other or to communicate with others, except with supervisors or members of the Commission.

Art. 5 - Appointment of the Examining Commission and the Head of the Procedure

The selection Commission is appointed by the Rector, on the proposal of the Director of the Department of Biology.

The person in charge of the administrative procedure is identified, according to Art. 4 of Law 241/90, in the person of Dr. Antonella Mariucci - Head of the Student Secretariat Office of School of Science.

The responsible for the procedure is the Coordinator of the One- cycle Degree in Pharmacy, Prof Laura Di Renzo.

Art. 6 - General ranking list

For each selection round, the General Ranking list will be published on the University website <http://web.uniroma2.it> => Offerta Formativa => select the single-cycle degree course of interest, on the website of the Macro-area of Science <http://www.scienze.uniroma2.it> e and on the website of the single-cycle degree course in Pharmacy <https://farmacia.uniroma2.it/> on the dates indicated below. The publication



of the Rankings shall be considered for all purposes as official communication of the results. No other form of communication of the merit rankings or of any subsequent sliding rankings is foreseen.

PLEASE NOTE: A specific ranking will be proposed for non -EU citizens residing abroad who apply for a study visa.

The General Ranking list, will be formulated and approved by the Commission inserting only candidates that:

- have duly registered within the set deadlines (see Art. 3)
- have passed the written test with a score equal to or higher than 24/60.
- have subsequently passed the oral interview with a minimum score of 10/20.

The rankings will be drawn up based on the overall marks obtained in the written test and the oral interview. Candidates who obtain a score of 34/80 or higher (sum of the minimum pass marks in the two tests) will be considered successful.

In the event of a tie, the youngest candidate will prevail.

- **FIRST ROUND - no. 40 places** of which 10 places reserved for non-EU citizens resident abroad:
 - **General Ranking List publication: from Thursday 27 March 2025**
 - **Pre-enrolment deadline (see art. 8): By Wednesday 2 July 2025**
 - **Enrolment deadline (see art. 9): By Friday 29 August 2025**

Candidates who are successful in the first round of selection must complete the pre-enrolment procedure and subsequently enrol by the specified deadlines outlined in Articles 8 and 9. If admitted candidates fail to meet these deadlines, they will be deemed to have withdrawn, and the available spots will be opened up for the second round of selection.

N.B.: for the first selection round, there will be no shortlisting.

- **SECOND ROUND - 40 seats** of which 10 seats are reserved for non-EU citizens residing abroad, in addition to any seats that may have become available at the end of the first round for each category:
 - **General Ranking List publication: from Thursday 17 July 2025**
 - **Enrolment deadlines:**
 - Entry of matriculation application on Delphi: Friday **22 August 2025**
 - Payment of first instalment: Friday **29 August 2025**

Successful candidates in the second selection round must complete the **enrolment procedure** by the specified deadlines established in Art 9. Failure to do so will result in withdrawal from the process, and the vacant positions will be filled by the next candidates on the list.

Art. 7 - Eventual Supplementary ranking Lists (second selection round)

If, among the candidates in the **SECOND SELECTION ROUND** who were included in the list as winners, there are any dropouts, supplementary lists will be published on the dates indicated below.

First shortlisting - publication date: from **Thursday 4 September 2025**

- **Enrolment deadlines:**
 - Entry of matriculation application on Delphi: **Wednesday 10 September 2025**



- Payment of first instalment: **Monday 15 September 2025**

Second shortlisting – publication date: from Thursday **18 September 2025**

- Enrolment deadlines:
 - Entry of matriculation application on Delphi: Wednesday **24 September 2025**
 - Payment of first instalment: **Monday 29 September 2025**

If there are withdrawals by the enrolment deadline for the second shortlist, a NOTICE will be posted on the University, Macroarea of Sciences, and Degree Course in Pharmacy websites, **detailing how to fill the available spots and the registration deadlines.**

Art. 8 - Pre-enrolment procedure (First selection round)

Candidates who successfully pass the **FIRST SELECTION ROUND** must complete the following steps to enrol in the single-cycle master's degree course in Pharmacy for the academic year 2025/2026:

- a. Complete the pre-enrolment procedure **by the deadline of 2 July 2025**;
- b. Complete the enrolment procedure **by the deadline of 29 August 2025. (For more details, please refer to Article 9).**

a. Pre-enrolment procedure (by 2 July 2025).

- 1. Access the Delphi Online Services website:** <http://delphi.uniroma2.it>
- 2. Select Student Section, Key 2 – Pre-Enrolment> Select a “Start application procedures”**
 - ⇒ **NOTE:** Please keep the identification code CTRL and the FISCAL CODE safe, as they are necessary for retrieving your application during future procedures.
- 3. Pay the pre-enrolment fee of €156.00.**
- 4. Payment must be made using the "PagoPA" system, which has been established by the Agency for Digital Italy (AgID). This system allows for payments through various channels, both physical and online. For more information about the available payment methods, please visit the following link:**

- 5. Validate the payment** by connecting to delphi.uniroma2.it > **Student Area** > Key 2 **“Pre-enrolment”** > key b **“you have already filled out the application”**.

NOTE: that individuals who do not fulfil all requirements by the specified deadlines will be regarded as having withdrawn, resulting in the reassignment of available positions in the next selection round.

Please note that the amount of €156 will be converted at the time of enrolment as per art. 9, in the payment of the first installment consisting of €16 stamp duty (not refundable for any reason) and €140 regional tax for the right to study.

- ⇒ Reimbursement of the regional tax for the right to study reserved for successful/eligible students the DiSCo competition is managed directly by the LazioDiSco regional body.

No refunds will be given to those who, after pre-enrolment, decide not to matriculate, or to those who do not meet the requirements specified in the notice and current regulations regarding the recognition of foreign degrees.



NOTE:

- Candidates who are successful but fail to complete the requirements outlined in this article by the specified deadlines and in the prescribed manner will be regarded as drop-outs. Consequently, they will not be permitted to matriculate as stated in Article 9 below.

b. Complete the enrolment procedure (by 29 August 2025) For more details, please refer to Article 9.

Art. 9 – Enrolment procedure

Successful candidates in the FIRST RANKING LIST must compulsorily fulfil the requirements set out in the enrolment procedure by the deadlines indicated below, following the instructions at the link: <https://studenti.uniroma2.it/immatricolazione/>.

In particular:

- **FIRST ROUND:**

After entering your pre-enrolment by July 2, 2024, you must confirm it between July 17, 2025, and August 29, 2025, using the methods below to obtain your matriculation number.

1. Connect to the University's Online Services site: <https://delphi.uniroma2.it> > Student Area > Key 2 > "Pre-enrolment" > key b > "you have already filled out the application", enter CF and ctrl of the pre-enrolment application > "edit pre-enrolment application".
2. Enter graduation grade (if missing) and date of entry into the university system.

Click on "Confirm pre-enrolment." **Please note that foreign degree holders will necessarily have to upload the documents required for matriculation purposes and wait for the documentation to be checked by the international students office** so that the procedure can be completed with the assignment of the matriculation number.

- **SECOND ROUND:**

- **by 22 August 2025:** enter the matriculation application on the Delphi University online services portal; <https://delphi.uniroma2.it>;
- **by 29 August 2025:** Pay and validate the first instalment slip amounting to 156.00 euros consisting of a regional fee (140.00 euros) and stamp duty (16.00 euros) to confirm enrolment.

First shortlisting:

- **by 10 September 2025:** enter the matriculation application on the Delphi University online services portal; <https://delphi.uniroma2.it>;
- **by 15 September 2025:** Pay and validate the first instalment slip amounting to 156.00 euros consisting of a regional fee (140.00 euros) and stamp duty (16.00 euros) to confirm enrolment.

Second shortlisting:

- **by 24 September 2025:** enter the matriculation application on the Delphi University online services portal; <https://delphi.uniroma2.it>;



- **by 29 September 2025:** Pay and validate the first instalment slip amounting to 156.00 euros consisting of a regional fee (140.00 euros) and stamp duty (16.00 euros) to confirm enrolment.

PLEASE NOTE: Admitted candidates who have not enrolled by the deadline described will be considered as **dropouts**.

Any variations with respect to what is indicated in this article will be communicated at the same time as the publication of the rankings on the institutional websites of the University, of the Macro-area of MM.FF.NN. Sciences and of the Single-cycle degree course in Pharmacy in English.

For candidates with **qualifications obtained abroad, please refer to the further information in art. 12** of this call for applications.

Art. 10 - Payment of university taxes and contributions

All information regarding the calculation of taxes and contributions, with the related deadlines and payment methods, will be available in the 2025/2026 Student Guide published on the University websites <https://web.uniroma2.it/en>, and <https://www-2023.studenti.uniroma2.it/en/>,

The Guide will also specify all the possibilities of total or partial exemption from the payment of taxes and contributions.

Art. 11 – Course transfers, passages and course abbreviations

According to the procedure set out in this announcement, admission is also necessary for:

- a. for students enrolled at other universities who intend to apply for a transfer.
- b. for students enrolled at the University of Rome "Tor Vergata" who intend to request a change of course.

These students, after having been usefully placed on the ranking list as "winners", within the enrolment deadlines, must proceed with the transfer or transfer application **as indicated in Annex 1 of this call**.

- c. for students who intend to apply for a **shortening of their course** because they have already graduated or have completed and unfinished careers at other degree courses or other universities (including foreign ones).

In this case, the student, after having carried out the normal enrolment procedure, must submit a written request to the Student Secretariat Office accompanied by appropriate documentation of the examinations taken and the programmes of the courses taken. The programmes must be duly validated by the relevant academic office.

PLEASE NOTE: successful students who matriculate following a request to change course or transfer from another university and who possess additional qualifications or academic studies carried out at foreign universities must request recognition **at the same time as completing their matriculation** by submitting the appropriate application in the manner reported on the Degree Course in Pharmacy website at the link: <https://farmacia.uniroma2.it/apply-transfer/transfers-course-abbreviations/>

Requests for recognition of examinations or integration of recognition submitted at different times will not be accepted.



Art. 12 - Candidates with qualifications obtained abroad and international candidates applying for a visa

- foreign **access title**
- Final secondary school qualification obtained with at least 12 years of schooling

For more information regarding the validity of degrees obtained abroad, please refer to the ministerial procedures for the academic year 2025/26, which can be found at the following link: <http://www.studiare-in-italia.it/studentistranieri/>. Specifically, we recommend reviewing Attachment 1 and Attachment 2 if you have a degree from the following categories:

- A U.S. degree
- A degree from the United Kingdom
- A degree awarded by ecclesiastical universities based in Italy and approved by the Holy See
- An Italian degree from frontier schools or Italian sections of foreign schools
- An International Bacalaureate degree
- A degree from the Republic of San Marino
- Degrees awarded at foreign schools operating in Italy or at European schools.

IMPORTANT:

All students in possession of a foreign qualification and international students applying for a visa, who have completed all the procedures described above and have been successful in the selection process, must proceed with enrolment within the deadlines set out in the Announcement/Notice by following the instructions available at the following links:

According to Article 2 of Law 148/2002 and its subsequent amendments, university institutions have the autonomy to determine the documentation required for enrolment purposes. Therefore, the university reserves the right to request additional documentation if necessary.

N.B: Students with a foreign qualification are advised to prepare the study documents required for enrolment well in advance.

All interested candidates are invited to check the closing periods of the CIMEA on their website: <https://www.cimea.it/>.

In the event of irregularities in the documentation provided relating to the foreign qualification, the student's enrolment will be automatically cancelled.

- **Visa Application Procedure**



International students residing abroad who wish to obtain a visa must follow the pre-enrolment application procedure. To do this, applicants need to submit their pre-enrolment application through the University portal (<https://www.universitaly.it/>) The deadlines for submission are as follows: March 5, 2025, for participation in the first selection round, and July 2, 2025, for the second selection round. After you have submitted your pre-enrolment application, please allow time for the University to complete the validation process. Once validation is received, you are advised to reach out to the relevant diplomatic representatives to finalize the necessary procedures.

NOTE: International students residing abroad who are seeking visas and enrolling in single courses at the University of Tor Vergata or other universities for the 2024/2025 academic year **must pass at least one exam related to these courses by the enrolment deadline**. It is essential that the courses are relevant to the degree programs specified. Note that the "English language" course does not meet enrolment requirements.

○ **Completion of the enrolment procedure**

International students in possession of a foreign qualification, who have already completed the operations indicated in articles 9 and 10, must complete the enrolment in person by November 5, 2025, at the International Students Secretariat Via Cracovia, 50 – 00133 ROME – Building D floor 0 room no. 1 (email address: international.students@uniroma2.it). At this stage, enrolment will be validated and the matriculation number assigned.

Non-EU students who hold a regular residence permit and have qualifications from an institution within the Italian educational system must complete their enrolment at the Student Secretariat of Mathematical, Physical, and Natural Sciences. This enrolment should be done within the deadlines specified in the announcement. The Secretariat will verify the residence permit and subsequently assign a matricola number.

Art. 13 – Students with specific learning disorders (SLD).

Students with a disability equal to or greater than 66% and/or with a recognised disability pursuant to art. 3, paragraphs 1 and 3 of law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 and/or with a diagnosis of specific learning disorders (DSA) pursuant to law no. 170/2010, when registering on Delphi, as per art. 2 of this notice, may declare that they are students with disabilities or SLD.

The above certifications must be sent, scanned in PDF format, to the CARIS Secretariat at the following e-mail address: segreteria@caris.uniroma2.it, at the same time as the request for dispensatory measures and compensatory tools (additional time, use of non-scientific calculator and reader tutor, technological aids, LIS interpreters, etc.) that may be required for the entrance test.

Applicants with disabilities or with SLD residing in foreign countries, who wish to take advantage of the above-mentioned measures, must also forward, scanned in PDF format, by e-mail to the CARIS secretariat at the following address: segreteria@caris.uniroma2.it, the certification accompanied by a sworn translation in Italian or in English from the Italian embassy competent for the territory attesting to the state of disability or SLD.

The CARIS Secretariat will examine the certifications and assess their suitability and consequently authorise the granting of the measures requested; it will also inform the candidate by e-mail.

PLEASE NOTE: The University reserves the right to verify the truthfulness of all declarations made. Please also note that anyone who makes false declarations, draws up false documents or uses them shall be punished in accordance with the Penal Code and the relevant laws.



At the time of enrolment, in order to request partial or total exemption from fees (where applicable) or all the services provided for by law and provided by CARIS, students, in addition to ticking the relevant item when enrolling on Delphi, must produce the certifications to the CARIS Secretariat, also by sending good quality scans in PDF format, to the email address: segreteria@caris.uniroma2.it. All documents containing sensitive data will be kept by the CARIS office in compliance with the regulations in force.

In particular:

- Students with a disability equal to or greater than 66% or with recognition of a disability pursuant to Article 3, paragraphs 1 and 3 of Law no. 104 of 5 February 1992 are totally exempt from paying university fees and contributions for enrolment and must follow the same 'on-line enrolment' procedure provided for all students, self-certifying the disability in the same enrolment application. To proceed with the enrolment procedure, they will then have to deliver or send to the CARIS Secretariat all the documentation issued by the competent authorities certifying their disability status.
- It is also possible, following the same procedure, to request a 20% discount on the amount of the second instalment for students with a recognised disability of between 46% and 65%.

In the event of non-presentation or ineligibility of the documentation submitted by the student, the latter will be required to pay all university fees and contributions.

During studies, the request for dispensatory measures and compensatory tools for each individual course to be followed or examination must instead be made with specific written requests to CARIS.

There is no fee waiver for students with SLD, who may, however, apply for dispensatory measures and compensatory tools for the entrance test and for their university course by following the same accreditation and document delivery procedures set out above.
