



Instructions for thesis preparation

The thesis should be about **60-70 pages in total** (with possible exceptions).

Frontispiece: view file

Pages: numbered, excluding the frontispiece, index, and/or any dedications and acknowledgements.

Font: *Times New Roman o Arial*; **12 pt** text, **14 pt** or **16 pt** titles

Interline: 1,5

Edges: left **3,5 cm**, right **2,5 cm**.

Setting:

- Index
- Abstract
- Introduction with purpose of work
- Chapters (Whether experimental with Materials and methods - Results)
- Conclusions
- Bibliography

Bibliography (chapter at the end): report citations in alphabetical order beginning with the author's last name (check that the last name matches the one cited throughout the text and all references cited are given).

Formatting of bibliographic references: as reported in PubMed.

Es.: Savini I, Catani MV, Evangelista D, Gasperi V, Avigliano L. Obesity-associated oxidative stress: strategies finalized to improve redox state. *Int J Mol Sci.* 2013 May 21;14(5):10497-538

Bibliographic citation in the text should be given, in parentheses, as follows:

- (Savini et al., 2013)*, if the authors are more than two;
- (Savini & Catani, 2013)*, if the authors are only two;
- (Savini, 2013)*, if the author is only one.

Figures, tables, graphs. The use of explanatory figures and tables is encouraged as much as possible, and they should be numbered consecutively and have clear reference within the text. Each figure should be accompanied by an underlying legend (Times New Roman; carattere 11, interlinea 1,5) Each table, on the other hand, should be accompanied by an overlying title (Times New Roman; carattere 11, interlinea 1,5). For figures and tables taken from other texts, the original bibliographic sources must be cited in the legend/title according to the formatting given in Section 6 or the website link.
